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DESCRIPTION OF THE DISCIPLINE

The relevance of the study of the discipline "Ethno-political processes in Ukraine" is due to the growing role of the ethnic factor in modern political processes and the attempts of external forces to use it to inflame ethno-political conflicts. The educational course is designed to form in students a system of knowledge about the trends of the ethno-national policy of Ukraine and the ethno-political development of Ukrainian society in historical retrospect, ensuring the rights of ethnic minorities, tolerance in the ethno-national sphere, etc., and to develop and develop in them the skills of independent analysis of ethno-political processes, the ability to foresee prospects their development.
